MAE126B course components

Main components

- Research (small literature study)
- Study design (e.g. to develop an experiment)
- Design / Experimental analysis (actual experiments, computations, drawings, construction)
- Documentation (presentation, report or poster)
- Outcome: working prototype / laboratory experiment

MAE126B projects

Organization

- Each project has a
 - Project Advisor (person you closely work with and meet on a regular basis)
 - Course Advisor (person who evaluates your work and meet once a week for progress on project)
- Each student in group (of 4) working on projects gets assigned a *specific responsibility*.

MAE126B typical schedule of events

- 1. Presentation of possible projects
- 2. Review projects on class website
- Sign up for a project (group of 4)
- 4. Meet with Project Advisor in 1st week
- 5. Background research, project planning and organization in 1st, and 2nd week
- 6. Initial Design / Experimental results by 4th week
- 7. Refine design / experiments, collect data in remaining weeks
- 8. Final report and poster

MAE126B How to sign up for a project

Make sure you:

- Form a group of 3 to 5 students to work together and assign one person as contact person.
- Decide on projects that you would like to work on, with
 4 choices in order of priority.
- The contact person sends email request to Prof. Kleissl not earlier than Thu Mar 23, 5pm
- The projects are:
 - Assigned on first come, first serve basis
 - Pre-assigned (partially) in case a project was proposed by students

MAE126B email request

- The contact person of the group sends a single email to jkleissl@ucsd.edu not earlier than Thu Mar 23, 5pm
- In your email request make sure to mention:
 - The names and email addresses of 3-5 persons in your group
 - The name and project numbers of your 1st 4 choices for projects in order of preference
- Emails requests that have either
 - Less than 3 or more than 5 persons in a group
 - a person signing up for multiple groups
 - will move to bottom of priority list
